TOTO CLUB LAUNCHED IN KARIOBANGI SLUMS

Slum child has been running a children club in the slums of Korogocho slums where engage them in various child friendly activities like art work, theatre, life skills just to mention a few. This has attracted many kids and many child friendly groups asking us to help them start the same. We evaluated the areas that most kids were coming from and realized that it was Kariobangi and since the distance was long, we decided to start a club for them doing the same things we are doing with





the teachers in Korogocho, we started with 20 kids and in a span of three months the number has grown to seventy, we are looking forward to launch another club at the edge of Korogocho slums and Dandora since we have more children coming from that side.

I know many are asking, how we are doing it. We are working with office of children department at the location level to help us know them better, the public school that provide venue for the meetings and through our partnership with Cooperative university, they have

given us five students for three months with whom we have divided them into two, one team goes to Korogocho and the other goes to Kariobangi to help run the club.

We are looking forward to strengthen these partnerships for the better and growth of the organization and these children club which will be centered on the best interest of children, our long term plan is reach children within all the slums through these clubs come 2020, but 2030 we are looking forward to have them in all the regions we will be operating in Kenya.



THREE MONTHS TRAINING FOR TOTO CLUB KIDS

In May we launched a three months training with Toto clubs kids as Child right ambassadors, the training that is currently being conducted in the two Toto clubs in Korogocho and Kariobangi slums respectively target children aged between 10 years to 14 year and they are taught about various aspects of life and how they can

cope up with them



At the end of the training those who

will have completed the lessons well and pass their exams will graduate. We are looking forward to get partnership with various stakeholders to see this program continue beyond the three months.

In July we are looking forward to their graduation especially those who have consistence.

SCF INTERVENTION FOR THE CLOSURE OF ILLEGAL CHILDREN HOME





Being a children centered right children organization working in the slums of Korogocho, slum child foundation got reports from media and members of the community about existence of a children home that was operating in Kariobangi but the condition of the children in the home was pathetic.

We took the initiative to investigate and realized that the children in the children home were ferried from Nyeri county to Nairobi county with promises that they will be sponsored to get education and other basic needs, but this did not turn out to be what they wanted, the more

than 60 children were in pain. So of the Kasarani area advisory council for children affairs and through the office of the children department, action was taken and the police were called on board to investigate if it was true and they got the same information and the home was closed on the spot and the children were transferred to the Nairobi children Home as they awaited to be taken home. The Nairobi county children officer for acknowledged and appreciated the work that was done by slum child

foundation and members of the pubupon informing the other members lic for the good job and encouraged the same to other parts of the country as the owner of the home which was not also registered disappeared. As we write this letter the matter is with the police who are doing ground work to ensure everyone get back to their families as children department works on how they can access basic needs and get temporary education support.





SCHOOL OUTREACH

This is a program that brings all the school we work with, this month we were able to visit 6 schools each having an average of 150 students.



During this month we were able to cover the following issues: Substance abuse, HIV/AIDs offered counseling and life skills. We were able to reach two schools with journalism skills and we are so far working on how we can enhance the program to other schools and we are looking forward to forge partnership with other key stakeholders to come up

It's a dream of every child to have a better life

in future not like the one spent at early childhood. As they wake up every morning they hope for a brighter day but that's not the case with the slum child. Different family setups face different challenges.

Akinyi is a daughter of a single parent with six siblings, for them life has not been that easy to deal with due to the intense level of poverty.

Attaining their daily basic needs is nothing but a miracle. Going to school to every other kid is normal routine but to Akinyi



and her siblings is a huge mountain with no hope of going through it. They live with the hope that a well-wisher will come their way and give them the hope of a brighter fu-

ture, the same wish other kids living in the same condition as Akinyi's family.

Through our home visits programs 90% of the families mostly faces similar challenges of lack of basic needs; i.e. food, clothing, shelter, lack of enough space to accommodate the family, poor sanitation etc. been able to incorporate some of parents of these kids into vocational



training to enable them earn a living to support their families. Although we have been able to offer sponsorship to some of the kids we have not managed to incorporate all the kids but



we hope that we shine a light on the path of these kids as they strive to a brighter future they dream of.
